

Author pens book after university trips

Writer inspired by personal experiences

AN author from Stafford with 30 years' experience in the probation service has put pen to paper to release his fourth book.

Crime and politics writer Chris Boult has released the Green Terror.

The 58-year-old retired from working for the probation service in 2015, after a series of health problems.

His new book taps into the current concerns of international affairs, terrorism and inequality in the world.

After making dozens of visits to pick his son up from Oxford University, he was inspired by the experience and mixed it with his knowledge to publish the book.

Topical

He said: "My latest book is very topical and deliberately short for the busy person of today. It features a group of students at Oxford who have a shared interest in environmental issues and get involved in green politics.

"Later from their respective positions of power they grapple with conflicts of loyalty versus duty as the world tries to deal with threats of environmental terrorism."
